SECTION I - GENERAL RULES

†[N]PASSENGER BAGGAGE TRANSPORTATION WORLDWIDE EXCEPT BETWEEN POINTS IN AREA 2 AND USA/CANADA (WEIGHT CONCEPT) (Applicable to LO only)

(A) ACCEPTANCE OF BAGGAGE(1) General Conditions of Acceptance

LO will accept for transportation as baggage, such personal property as is necessary or appropriate for the wear, use, comfort or convenience of the passenger for the purpose of the trip, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Nothing contained in this tariff shall entitle a passenger to have his/her baggage checked on a journey for which LO does not offer facilities for checking of baggage.
- (b) Movement of Baggage
Checked baggage will be accepted in the same aircraft as the passenger unless such carriage is deemed impractical by LO in which event LO will move the baggage in the next subsequent flight on which space is available.
- (c) LO has the right to refuse to transport baggage on any flight other than the one carrying the passenger.
- (d) Upon delivery to LO of the baggage to be checked, LO will insert in the ticket the number of pieces and weight of the checked baggage (this act shall constitute the issuance of the baggage check); in addition LO will issue for identification purposes only, a baggage (claim) tag(s) for each piece of baggage so delivered and covered by the baggage check. All checked baggage must be properly packed in suitcases or similar containers in order to ensure safe carriage with ordinary care in handling. Fragile or perishable articles, money, jewelry, silverware, negotiable papers, securities or other valuables will not be accepted as checked baggage.
- (e) Conditions and Limitations or Restrictions
For the acceptance of baggage which are applicable to LO as outlined in this tariff apply locally on LO or for interline transportation where LO is involved in the routing.

(B) INSPECTION BY CARRIER

LO has the right, but not the obligation, to verify in the presence of the passenger the contents of his baggage, and in the case of unaccompanied baggage, to open and examine such baggage whether or not the passenger is present. The existence or exercise of such right shall not be construed as an agreement, expressed or implied, by LO to carry such contents as would otherwise be precluded from carriage.

(C) DANGEROUS, DAMAGEABLE OR UNSUITABLE BAGGAGE

Passenger must not include in his/her baggage articles which are likely to endanger the aircraft, persons, or property, which are likely to be damaged by air carriage or which are unsuitably packed, or the carriage of which due to security reasons is forbidden by any applicable laws, regulations or orders of any state to be flown from, into, or over. If the weight size or character of baggage renders it unsuitable for carriage on the aircraft, LO, prior to or at any stage of the journey, will refuse to carry the baggage.

As the general rule, dangerous goods must not be carried by passengers or crew:

- as or in checked baggage,
- as or in carry-on baggage, or
- on their person.

Except as specified in actual edition TABLE 2.3.A. of IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations.

The following articles will be carried as baggage only with the prior consent of and arrangement with LO, in accordance with LO regulations:

(1) Firearms and Ammunition

- (a) Firearms will be accepted only when unloaded and suitably packed and when checked for carriage in the baggage or other compartment of the aircraft not accessible to the passenger.
- (b) At the time of check-in, firearm(s) will be surrendered and the passenger will be required to make a verbal declaration that the firearm(s) as surrendered is safe for transportation.
- (c) When firearm(s) used for sport, hunting, other purposes are carried on the aircraft, an appropriate license(s) and permit(s) for carriage of weapons shall be in possession of the passenger.

EXCEPTION: An authorized Polish officer performing a duty on board an aircraft is permitted to retain custody of his/her firearm and ammunition upon duly identifying himself/herself at the time of check-in.

- (d) Less than 5 Kilograms (11 lb.) gross weight ammunition (in Division 1.4S, UN 0012 or UN 0014 only) per person for that person's own use, excluding ammunition with explosive or incendiary projectiles. Ammunition should be securely packed.
- (2) Live animals, other than pets, service animals trained to lead the blind and to assist the deaf.

(C) DANGEROUS, DAMAGEABLE OR UNSUITABLE BAGGAGE (Continued)

(3) Pets

Acceptability

PETS i.e. dogs and cats only, when properly crated in leak proof containers and accompanied valid health and rabies vaccination certificates, valid passports (including chips if required by law) entry permits and other documents required by countries of entry or transit will be accepted for carriage at the owner's risk, and subject to requirements of LO. LO may limit the number and type of pets, refuse to carry in any one aircraft either in the baggage or cargo hold or in the passenger cabin, or refuse to carry pet(s) if it requires attention in transit. If any country or territory on the route prohibits the entry of pets, carriage will be refused. LO will not be responsible in the event any such pet is refused entry or passage through any country or territory. The owner assumes all risk of injury to or sickness or death of such animal.

(4) Photoflash bulbs will be accepted when appropriately marked and contained in the original package of the manufacturer.

(5) Restricted articles which cannot be accepted in passenger baggage: Compressed gases, (deeply refrigerated, flammable, non-flammable and poisonous) such as butane, oxygen, liquid nitrogen, aqualung cylinders; corrosives such as acids, alkalis, mercury and wet batteries; explosives, munitions, ammunition, fireworks and flares, flammable liquids and solids (such as matches, lighter fuels, paints, thinners, fireproofers, rectified spirit, rubbing alcohol); oxidizing materials such as bleaching powder peroxides; poisons infectious substances such as insecticides, weed-killers and live virus materials, radioactive materials; and other restricted articles (such as materials, offensive or irritating materials).

EXCEPTION: Matches may be carried on the person.

(D) FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE

Free baggage allowance for passenger other than children

(1) Maximum allowance

When the passenger presents a valid ticket for transportation between points on LO, LO will transport the passenger's baggage between such points without charge, subject to conditions of acceptance below and the allowance set forth in this rule. For purposes as the number of pieces of baggage that will be carried, either as checked baggage or carry-on baggage, free of charge provided such baggage meets the specified maximum outside linear dimensions and maximum weight of each piece.

(2) Combined Services

(a) For through journeys where the passenger travels partly on first/business class and partly on economy/Tourist/Coach or third class services, the free baggage allowance for each portion of the trip shall be that applicable to the class of service for which the fare is paid.

(b) When the passenger who has paid the first/business class fare travels on economy/tourist/coach or third class service, the free baggage allowance will be that applicable to the first/business class service.

(3) Free Baggage Allowance for Passengers other than Children

(a) In business class service the free baggage allowance will be 30 kg (66 lb) of baggage. EXCEPTION: For FTL maximum 40 kg (88 lb) together with baggage allowance i.e. in C class- 30 plus additional 11 kg, Senator and Star Alliance gold customers -extra 20 kg (44 lb) irrespective of free baggage allowance.

(b) In economy/Tourist/holiday class service 20 kg (44 lb)

(C) EXCEPTIONS:

i) Individual fares for ships crew. Free baggage allowance may be the applicable first/business class baggage allowance;

ii) For flight numbers between LO6000-6999 17 kg (37 lb); Excl LO6423-6426/6431-6434/6578-6880/6585-6586/6597-6598 15 kg (37 lb).

- (D) FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE (Continued)
- (4) Carry-On Baggage
- (a) In addition to the free baggage allowances provided herein, each passenger may carry, without additional charges, the following articles of baggage only when retained in the passenger's custody; except that items listed in D(4) (vii) and (viii) subject to space availability, may be carried in cargo hold of the aircraft:
- (i) A handbag, pocketbook or purse
 - (ii) An overcoat, wrap or blanket
 - (iii) An umbrella or walking stick
 - (iv) A small camera or pair of binoculars
 - (v) A reasonable amount of reading matter for the flight
 - (vi) Infant's food for consumption in flight
 - (vii) Infant's carrying basket or bassinet
 - (viii) Any fully collapsible invalid's chair/wheelchair or other devices for invalid passenger and/or a pair of crutches/a cane, and/or braces or the prosthetic devices for the passenger's use, provided that the passenger is dependent upon them.
 - (ix) Any other articles, including overnight bags, brief cases, typewriter, personal radios, vanity or cosmetic cases, hat boxes, large cameras and reading matter which cannot reasonably be read during the flight will not be carried free unless they are included in the free baggage allowance.
- (b) The total dimensions and weight of given above baggage (except items listed in (vi)(vii) and (viii) above should be as follows:
- (i) In business class 2 pieces of baggage on board provided that the outside linear dimensions do not exceed 115 cm (45 in) and the weight does not exceed 9 Kg (20 lb.)
 - (ii) In economy class 1 piece of baggage on board provided that the outside linear dimensions do not exceed 115 cm (45 in) and maximum weight does not exceed 6 Kg (13 lb.)
- These dimensions include wheels, handles and side pockets.
- (5) Service Animals Accompanying Passengers
 A service animal trained to lead the blind or to assist the deaf will be carried free of charge in addition to the normal free baggage allowance provided that such animal accompanies the passenger with impaired vision dependent upon it, and is properly harnessed and does not occupy a seat. In case of dog-muzzle for dog. However such animals will not be carried unless proper permits are obtained for entry into the country or territory of destination and country or territory of transit, where such permits are required and only if the evidence of possession of such permits are presented prior to reservations being made. If any country or territory on the route prohibits the entry of any service animal, carriage will be refused. LO will not be responsible in the event any such animal is refused entry into or passage through any country or territory. The owner assumes all risk of injury to or sickness or death of such animal.
EXCEPTION: On board of ATR 72/42, EMB 145, ERJ 170 guarantees extra seat under which such service animal will be transported free of charge.
- (6) Accompanied Pets
 Accompanied pets, when accepted, including the containers carried, will not be included in the free baggage allowance of the passenger, and the passenger will be assessed the applicable excess baggage charge.
- (E) FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE FOR CHILDREN
- (1) Children paying 10 percent of the normal adult fare will be allowed 11.0 Kg (22 lb) of checked baggage whose sum of the three dimensions does not exceed 115 cm (45 in). In addition children may carry without charge one fully collapsible child's stroller or push-chair or infant's carrying basket or infant's car seat which maybe carried on board subject to space availability.
[EXCEPTION: For flight numbers between CLO6000-6999, 5 kg., free baggage allowance permitted for infant without a seat.
- (2) Children paying 50 percent or more of the normal adult fare will be granted free baggage allowance on the same basis as a passenger paying the adult fare.
- (F) POOLING OF BAGGAGE
 Combination of free baggage allowance where two or more passengers traveling as one party to a common destination or point of stopover by the same flight, present themselves and their baggage for traveling at the same time and place, they shall be permitted a total free baggage allowance equal to the combination of their individual free baggage allowance.

(G) **SPECIAL BAGGAGE**

Other Special Pieces of Baggage

(1) Carriage of Pet - Pets and AVIH

Only cats and dogs can be admitted for pets or AVIH service. Other species can only be accepted for carriage as cargo (AVI). Charge for the carriage of accompanied pets and containers must be normal excess baggage one. Pets and containers are not allowed in the check baggage allowance.

EXCEPTION:

Seeing/hearing and assisting dogs are accepted free of charge (subject to the conditions described in paragraph (D)(5)).

(a) Carriage of pets in the cabin - The total weight of pets with container shall not exceed 8 kgs/17 lbs/and the dimensions of container shall not exceed 55 x 40 x 20 cm

EXCEPTION 1: ATR42 EMB145 - MAX 45 x 30 x 20 cm.

EXCEPTION 2: Dog trained to lead/assist the blind/deaf passenger

(2) Snow and water equipment consisting of:

- One pair of skis and one pair of ski poles and/or one pair of boots or
- One snowboard or
- One pair of standard water skis or one slalom water ski

The charge shall be equal to the applicable rate given in paragraph (N). Such charge shall only be assessed when these articles are not included in the free baggage allowance, when articles are included in the free baggage allowance any overweights at the above special charge or the normal baggage charge whichever is less, the charge shall be available for the carriage of only one set per passenger entitled to the seating place.

(3) Golfing Equipment Contained in not more than:

-One golf bag and one pair of golf shoes this equipment is allowed in the baggage allowance for the class of service paid. Any overweight resulting from this inclusion shall be assessed at the normal baggage charge or special charge given in paragraph (N) whichever is less

(4) Surfboarding Equipment/Windsurfer and Deltaglider shall not be included in the checked baggage allowance and shall be assessed as follows:

- (a) - One board not exceeding 277 cm (109 inches) to be charged at the applicable rate in paragraph (N) of excess baggage
- One board exceeding 277 cm (109 inches) to be charged at the applicable rate given in paragraph (N) of excess baggage
- (b) Any additional boards at the applicable excess baggage charge allowance.

- (5) Bicycles
 The charge for bicycle/one suitably packed bicycle/single seat touring or racing bicycle/non-motorized/or tandem provided that handlebars are fixed sideways and the pedals are removed/is:
 Bicycle may be included in the passenger's free baggage allowance. When the combined weight of the bicycle and the checked baggage allowance exceeds the free baggage allowance excess baggage given in paragraph (N) charges will apply.
- (6) Other Special pieces of Baggage
 - One portable musical instrument or nordic walking sticks not exceeding 100 cm (39 in) in length. This instrument may be included in the passenger's free baggage allowance.
- (H) CABIN SEAT BAGGAGE
 Cabin seat baggage and charges:
 when the passenger requests that an item of baggage be carried in the cabin and it is determined by LO that the item is acceptable as cabin baggage but it is so fragile and/or bulky as to require the use of a seat, the provisions specified below will apply.
- (1) Cabin seat baggage must be carried aboard the aircraft by the passenger and secured in a seat. Seat must be located next to the passenger's seat. Baggage must not protrude above the seat back. The maximum weight of any baggage under this arrangement must not exceed 75 kg (165 lb.) per seat.
- (2) LO will charge 100 percent of the applicable full adult fare, for the portion of the journey on which the extra seat is required. Inclusive tour or other rebated fares such as IN/CH/ID/AD/SC and fares YZZ or YZS may not be used. Cabin seat baggage will not be included in determining free baggage allowance or excess baggage charge.
- (3) The passengers checked baggage allowance must not be increased when using this facility.
- (I) EXCESS VALUE CHARGES
 Excess value charges for baggage:
 Excess Value Charges
- (1) Checked Baggage
 In case of checked baggage, the passenger may not declare a value for baggage in excess of USD 20.00 or its equivalent in other currency per kilogram.
- (2) Unchecked Baggage or Unchecked Property
 In case of unchecked baggage or unchecked property, the passenger may not declare a value for baggage in excess of USD/CAD 400 or its equivalent in other currency per kilogram.
- Exemption: For journey covered by the Montreal Convention or Community Regulation (EC) NO. 2027/97 (as amended by Regulation (EC) No. 889/2002) the limit of liability is SDR 1000.00 (approximately 1230 EUR) and LO will not accept declaration of value in excess of this amount.
- (J) VALUATION LIMIT OF BAGGAGE
 No baggage of any one passenger having the declared value in excess of USD 2800.00/CAD 2800.00 will be accepted for carriage. LO will not accept also declaration of value in excess of USD 20.00 per kilogram and USD 400.00 for unchecked/carry-on baggage.
- (K) EXCESS/OVERSIZE/OVERWEIGHT
 Payment of Charges
 LO may not be obliged to carry baggage until the passenger has paid all applicable charges.
- (L) Excess weight/oversize and/or additional baggage charges on rerouting or cancellations. When the passenger is rerouted or his carriage cancelled, the provisions, which govern with respect to, the payment of additional fares or the rerouting of fares shall likewise govern the payment of excess weight charges. No refund will be made when portion of the carriage has been completed.
- (M) AMOUNTS OF EXCESS BAGGAGE CHARGE
 These fares apply when LO (and its subsidiary K2) is the first operating carrier. Assessed and charged from the point for which the checked baggage allowance is exceeded to the first point at which the baggage is collected (excluding any transfers points where a passenger must collect baggage because of imposed regulations/requirements eg. for custom's clearance, change of airport):

(O) CHECKED AND CARRY ON BAGGAGE

Passenger may check baggage for carriage in the cargo hold of the aircraft and/or may carry baggage on board the aircraft subject to the provisions below. LO has the right, but not the obligation to verify in the presence of the passenger contents of his baggage, and in case of unaccompanied baggage, to open and examine such baggage whether or not the passenger is present. The existence or exercise of such right shall not be construed as an agreement, expressed or implied, by LO to carry such contents as would otherwise be precluded from carriage. The suitability of baggage, as to weight, size and character, to be carried in passenger cabin of the aircraft will be determined by LO.

(1) Checked Baggage:

Checking of baggage by carrier except as otherwise provided in this tariff, each participating carrier will, upon presentation by a fare-paying passenger of a valid ticket covering transportation over the lines of such carrier, or over the lines of such carrier and one or more other participating carriers, check personal property which is tendered by the passenger for transportation as baggage, when tendered at the city or airport office designated by the carrier, and within the times prescribed by such carrier, but no participating carrier will check property so tendered:

- (a) beyond the destination, or not on the routing, designated on such ticket;
- (b) beyond a point of stopover;
- (c) beyond a point of transfer to any other carrier, if the passenger has declared a valuation in excess of the amounts specified in paragraph (I) and (J) of this rule except between points where through interline service is provided without change of aircraft by two or more participating carriers;

(D) CHECKED AND CARRY ON BAGGAGE (Continued)

(1) Checked Baggage: (Continued)

- (d) beyond a point beyond which the passenger holds no reservation;
- (e) beyond a point at which the passenger is to transfer to a connecting flight, and such flight is scheduled to depart from a different airport than that at which the passenger is scheduled to arrive at such point;
- (f) beyond a point at which the passenger desires to resume possession of such property or any portion thereof;
- (g) beyond a point beyond which all applicable charges have not been paid; and
- (h) (applicable only for through transportation) to a point to which the passenger holds no reservation, unless the passenger's name or initials are on the outside of such baggage.

(2) Delivery of Checked Baggage by Carrier

- (a) Checked baggage will be delivered to the bearer of the baggage check upon payment of all unpaid sums due to LO under contract of carriage and upon return to LO of the baggage (claim) tag(s) issued in connection with such baggage. LO is under no obligation to ascertain that the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s) is entitled to delivery of the baggage and LO is not liable for any loss, damage or expense arising out of or in connection with such delivery of the baggage. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (C) herein, delivery will be made at the destination shown on the baggage check.
- (b) If the provisions of paragraph (A) above, are not complied with by a person claiming the baggage, LO will deliver the baggage only on condition that such person establishes to LO's satisfaction his/her rights thereto, and if required by LO, such person shall furnish adequate security to indemnify LO for any loss, damage or expense which may be incurred by carrier as a result of such delivery.
- (c) At the request of the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s), checked baggage will be delivered at the place of departure or an intermediate stopping place upon the same condition provided for in paragraph (A) herein, unless precluded by Government regulations, or unless time and circumstances do not permit. In delivering baggage at the place of departure or at any intermediate stopping place, LO shall be under no obligation to refund any charges paid.
- (d) Acceptance of baggage by the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s) without written complaint at the time of delivery is presumptive evidence that the baggage has been delivered in good condition and in accordance with the contract of carriage.

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90	<p>REFUNDS</p> <p>(A) GENERAL</p> <p>(1) In case of refund, whether due to failure of carrier to provide the accommodation called for by the ticket, or to voluntary change of arrangements by the passenger, the conditions and amount of refund will be governed by carrier's tariffs.</p> <p>(2) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (F) of this rule, refund by carrier for an unused ticket or portion thereof or Miscellaneous Charges Order will be made to the person named as the passenger in such ticket or Miscellaneous Charges Order unless at the time of purchase the purchaser designates on the ticket or Miscellaneous Charges Order another person to whom refund shall be made in which event refund will be made to persons so designated, and only upon delivery of the passenger coupon and all unused flight coupons of the ticket or Miscellaneous Charges Order. PETS i.e. dogs and cats only, when properly crated in leak proof containers and accompanied valid health and rabies vaccination certificates, valid passports (including chips if required by law) entry permits and other documents required by countries of entry or transit will be accepted for carriage at the owner's risk, and subject to requirements of LO. LO may limit the number and type of pets, refuse to carry in any one aircraft either in the baggage or cargo hold or in the passenger cabin, or refuse to carry pet(s) if it requires attention in transit. If any country or territory on the route prohibits the entry of pets, carriage will be refused. LO will not be responsible in the event any such pet is refused entry or passage through any country or territory. The owner assumes all risk of injury to or sickness or death of such animal.

(4) Photoflash bulbs will be accepted when appropriately marked and contained in the original package of the manufacturer.

(5) Restricted articles which cannot be accepted in passenger baggage: Compressed gases, (deeply refrigerated, flammable, non-flammable and poisonous) such as butane, oxygen, liquid nitrogen, acualung cylinders; corrosives such as acids, alkalis, mercury and wet batteries; explosives, munitions, ammunition, fireworks and flares, flammable liquids and solids (such as matches, lighter fuels, paints, thinners, firefighters, rectified spirit, rubbing alcohol); oxidizing materials such as bleaching powder peroxides; poisons infectious substances such as insecticides, weed-killers and live virus materials, radioactive materials; and other restricted articles (such as materials, offensive or irritating materials).

EXCEPTION: Matches may be carried on the person.

(D) FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE

Free baggage allowance for passenger other than children

(1) Maximum allowance

When the passenger presents a valid ticket for transportation between points on LO, LO will transport the passenger's baggage between such points without charge, subject to conditions of acceptance below and the allowance set forth in this rule. For purposes as the number of pieces of baggage that will be carried, either as checked baggage or carry-on baggage, free of charge provided such baggage meets the specified maximum outside linear dimensions and maximum weight of each piece.

(2) Combined Services

(a) For through journeys where the passenger travels partly on first/business class services, the free baggage allowance for each portion of the trip shall be that applicable to the class of service for which the fare is paid.

(b) When the passenger what has paid the first/business class fare travels on economy/tourist/coach or thrift class service, the free baggage allowance will be that applicable to the first/business class service.

(3) Free Baggage Allowance for Passengers other than Children

(a) In business class service the free baggage allowance will be two piece of baggage of which the sum of the greatest outside linear dimensions of each bag does not exceed 62 inches (158 cm), and the maximum weight does not exceed 32 kg (70 lb.) of each piece.
EXCEPTION: For FT Senator and Star Alliance Gold customers - 1 extra piece of weight of 32 kg (70 lb.) and maximum dimensions of 158 cm (62 in.).

(b) In economy/tourist/holiday class service one piece of baggage provided that the weight of this piece shall not be more than 23 kg (50 lb.) and the sum of the three dimensions shall not exceed 62 inches (158 cm) for each piece, and provided further that the overall dimensions does not exceed 107 inches (273 cm). Each piece of baggage weighting more than 23 kg (50 lb.) and not exceeding 32 kg. (70 lb.) will be subject to an overweight fee of EUR 40/60 (or equivalent in other currency) per exceeding piece.

(c) For any second piece to be checked-in which does not exceed 23 kg (50lb) and 158 cm (62 in.) a "second bag fee" of 165PLN/40EUR/60CAD/50USD (or equivalent in other currency) will be charged.

EXCEPTION 1: For HON, Senator and Star Gold frequent traveler customers 2 extra pieces of 23 kg (50 lb.) and maximum of 158 cm (62 in.)

EXCEPTION 2: For Frequent Traveler customers: 1 extra piece of weight of 23 kg (50 lb.) and maximum dimensions of 158 cm (62 in.);

EXCEPTION 3: Passengers travelling according Star Alliance Round The World Fares (rules ASK6 and ASK9)

(C)EXCEPTION 4: Individual fares for ships crew the free baggage allowance is the same as applicable in business class, i.e. two pieces 32 kg each.

(d) For handling purposes the maximum weight of any piece of the checked baggage shall not be more than 65 kg (70 lb.) in both class of service.

(4) Carry-On Baggage

In addition to the free baggage allowances provided herein, each passenger may carry, without additional charges, the following articles of baggage only when retained in the passenger's custody, except that items listed in D(4) g and h subject to space availability, may be carried in cargo hold of the aircraft:

- (a) A handbag, pocketbook or purse
- (b) An overcoat, wrap or blanket
- (c) An umbrella or walking stick
- (d) A small camera or pair of binoculars
- (e) A reasonable amount of reading matter for the flight
- (f) Infant's food for consumption in flight
- (g) Infant's carrying basket or bassinet
- (h) A fully collapsible invalid's chair and/or a pair of crutches, and/or braces or the prosthetic devices for the passenger's use, provided that the passenger is dependent upon them.
- (i) Any other articles, including overnight bags, brief cases, typewriter, personal radios, vanity or cosmetic cases, hat boxes, large cameras and reading matter which cannot reasonably be read during the flight will not be carried free unless they are included in the free baggage allowance.

The total dimensions and weight of given above baggage (except items listed in D(4),(f),(g) and (h) should be as follows:

- (1) In business class 2 pieces of baggage on board provided that the outside linear dimensions do not exceed 115 cm (45 in) and the weight does not exceed 9 kg (20 lb.)
- (2) In economy class 1 piece of baggage on board provided that the outside linear dimensions do not exceed 115 cm (45 in) and maximum weight does not exceed 6 kg (13 lb.)

[N]EXCEPTION: For flight numbers between CLO 6000-6999 - 5 kg (11 lb.). These dimensions include wheels, handles, side pockets.

(5) Dogs Accompanying Passengers

A dog trained to lead the blind or to assist the deaf will be carried free of charge in addition to the normal free baggage allowance provided that such a dog accompanies the passenger with impaired vision dependent upon it, and is properly harnessed and muzzled, and does not occupy a seat. However such dogs will not be carried unless proper permits are obtained for entry into the country or territory of destination and country or territory of transit, where such permits are required and only if the evidence of possession of such permits are presented prior to reservations being made. If any country or territory on the route prohibits the entry of dogs, carriage will be refused. LO will not be responsible in the event any such dog is refused entry into or passage through any country or territory. The owner assumes all risk of injury to or sickness or death of such animal.

(6) Accompanied Pets

Accompanied pets, when accepted, including the containers carried, will not be included in the free baggage allowance of the passenger, and the passenger will be assessed the applicable excess baggage charge.

(E) FREE BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE FOR CHILDREN

- (1) Children paying 10 percent of the normal adult fare will be allowed 1 piece of checked baggage whose sum of the three dimensions does not exceed 115 cm (45 in) and the weight does not exceed 12.3 kg (50 lb.). In addition children may carry without charge one fully collapsible child's stroller or push-chair or infant's carrying basket or infant's car seat which may be carried on board subject to space availability.
- (2) Children paying 50 percent or more of the normal adult fare will be granted free baggage allowance on the same basis as a passenger paying the adult fare.

(F) POOLING OF BAGGAGE

Combination of free baggage allowance where two or more passengers traveling as a one party to a common destination or point of stopover by the same flight, present themselves and their baggage for traveling at the same time and place, they shall be permitted a total free baggage allowance equal to the combination of their individual free baggage allowance [N]but the total weight of one piece of pooled baggage cannot exceed 32 kg. (70 lb.).

(N) CHECKED AND CARRY ON BAGGAGE

Passenger may check baggage for carriage in the cargo hold of the aircraft and/or may carry baggage on board the aircraft subject to the provisions below. LO has the right, but not the obligation to verify in the precedence of the passenger contents of his baggage, and in case of unaccompanied baggage, to open and examine such baggage whether or not the passenger is present. The existence or exercise of such right shall not be construed as an agreement, expressed or implied, by LO to carry such contents as would otherwise be precluded from carriage. The suitability of baggage, as to weight, size and character, to be carried in passenger cabin of the aircraft will be determine by LO.

(1) Checked Baggage:

Checking of baggage by carried except as otherwise provided in this tariff, each participating carrier will, upon presentation by a fare-paying passenger of a valid ticket covering transportation over the lines of such carrier, or over the lines of such carrier and one or more other participating carriers, check personal property which is tendered by the passenger for transportation as baggage, when tendered at the city or airport office designated by the carrier, and within the times prescribed by such carrier, but no participating carrier will check property so tendered:

(a) beyond the destination, or not on the routing, designated on such ticket;

(b) beyond a point of stopover;

(c) beyond a point of transfer to any other carrier, if the passenger has declared a valuation in excess of the amounts specified in paragraph (H) of this rule except between points where through interline service is provided without change of aircraft by two or more participating carriers;

(1) Checked Baggage: (Continued)

- (d) beyond a point beyond which the passenger holds no reservation;
- (e) beyond a point at which the passenger is to transfer to a connecting flight, and such flight is scheduled to depart from a different airport than that at which the passenger is scheduled to arrive at such point;
- (f) beyond a point at which the passenger desires to resume possession of such property or any portion thereof;
- (g) beyond a point beyond which all applicable charges have not been paid; and
- (h) (applicable only for through transportation) to a point to which the passenger holds no reservation, unless the passenger's name or initials are on the outside of such baggage.

(2) Delivery of Checked Baggage by Carrier

- (a) Checked baggage will be delivered to the bearer of the baggage check upon payment of all unpaid sums due to LO under contract of carriage and upon return to LO of the baggage (claim) tag(s) issued in connection with such baggage. LO is under no obligation to ascertain that the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s) is entitled to delivery of the baggage and LO is not liable for any loss, damage or expense arising out of or in connection with such delivery of the baggage. Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (C) herein, delivery will be made at the destination shown on the baggage check.
- (b) If the provisions of paragraph (A) above, are not complied with by a person claiming the baggage, LO will deliver the baggage only on condition that such person establishes to LO's satisfaction his rights thereto, and if required by LO, such person shall furnish adequate security to indemnify LO for any loss, damage or expense which may be incurred by carrier as a result of such delivery.
- (c) At the request of the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s), checked baggage will be delivered at the place of departure or an intermediate stopping place upon the same condition provided for in paragraph (A) herein, unless precluded by Government regulations, or unless time and circumstances do not permit. In delivering baggage at the place of departure or at any intermediate stopping place, LO shall be under no obligation to refund any charges paid.
- (d) Acceptance of baggage by the bearer of the baggage check and baggage (claim) tag(s) without written complaint at the time of delivery is presumptive evidence that the baggage has been delivered in good condition and in accordance with the contract of carriage.

- (A) Except as otherwise provided in this rule, stopovers within the validity period of the ticket will be permitted at any scheduled stop unless carrier's tariffs or government regulations do not permit a stopover at any such stop.
- (B) Stopovers must be arranged with carrier in advance and specified on ticket.

~~(C)~~ STOPOVERS AND TRANSFERS PART II (Applicable to IB only)(A) APPLICATION

Stopovers will be permitted under the following conditions:
(a) Stopovers will be arranged with the carrier in advance.
(b) Stopovers will be specified on the passenger ticket.

(B) COUNTING

To count the number of stopovers, the following applies:

- (1) In the case of round or circle trips, the stopover at the point of turnaround (fare construction point) is not counted.
- (2) In the case of turnaround open-jaw trips, the outward point of arrival and the inward point of departure together constitute one stopover which is not counted.
- (3) When one or more portions of a journey are travelled by surface the last point of arrival by air and the first point of departure by air on each such break in the journey together count as one stopover, provided that.
- (4) When a transit point is used as the origin or destination of a side trip, that point will be counted as a stopover unless the time interval between the arrival immediately preceding the sidetrip and the departure immediately following the sidetrip does not constitute a stopover as defined in Rule 1.
 - (a) If stopovers are restricted to a specific area and there is a surface sector involved, both points in the surface sector must be in such specific area.
 - (b) Where a specific routing permits stopovers at named point(s), both point of the surface sector must permit stopovers.
 - (c) Where a specific routing permits stopover at a named point, surface sectors to/from that named point are not permitted; provided surface sectors are permitted between two named stopover points.
 - (d) If one point has a stopover charge the charge must be assessed. If both points have stopover charges only (I) (the higher level) is assessed.
- (5) the stopover restriction of each fare will apply to the appropriate fare component over which the fare is assessed provided that the passenger will not receive more than the maximum number of stops in the least restrictive rule.

(C) TRANSFERS

Whenever a fare rule or note limits the number of transfers permitted, the following applies unless otherwise specified:

- A transfer is permitted at the point of turnaround/fare construction point and this transfers will not be counted.
- Where there is a surface break, the last point of arrival by air and the first point of departure together count as one transfer, unless the surface break terminated in or commences from the point of turnaround (fare construction point).
- If a transfer is restricted to a specific area and there is a surface sector involved, both points in the surface sector must be in the specific area. Surface sectors are permitted between two named transfer points in a routing.
